The Path Ahead

- Local voters **approved** both questions on the Shakopee Public Schools operating levy request in the November 2, 2021 special election
- Question 1 received 5,060 yes votes and 2,566 no votes (66.3% yes votes) and Question 2 received 4,774 yes votes and 2,836 no votes
